The Lord Lyon King of Arms, having further considered the Edinburgh, 18 March 2005; foregoing Petition, (Primo) OFFICIALLY RECOGNISES the Petitioner in the name Camilo Agasim-Pereiro of Fulwood, Baron of Fulwood, and (Secundo) AUTHORISES the Lyon Clerk to prepare Letters Patent granting unto the Petitioner and his descendants the following Ensigns Armorial, videlicet:- Per chevron engrailed Azure and Argent, in chief between a fleur de lys and a thistle slipped and leaved Or, a Magen David of the Second, in base a pear tree eradicated fructed Proper. Above the Shield, behind which is draped his feudo-baronial mantle Gules doubled of silk Argent, fur-edged of miniver and collar Ermine and fastened on the right shoulder by five spherical buttons Or, is placed a chapeau Gules furred Ermine (in respect of his feudal Barony of Fulwood), thereon an Helm befitting his degree with a Mantling Azure doubled Argent, and on a Wreath of his Liveries is set for Crest a lion sejant Or armed and langued Gules holding in its forepaws a mullet of six points Argent, inscribed in Hebrew with the words "The Lord is King", and in an Escrol over the same this Motto "IPSA SCIENTIA POTESTAS EST"; and for his Badge (as feudal Baron of Fulwood) a mullet of six points Argent, inscribed in Hebrew with the words "The Lord is King", which Badge is depicted in the first and third compartments and his said Crest in the centre compartment upon a Standard three and a half metres in length of four tracts Argent and Azure, split at the end, having Azure the cross of St. Andrew in the hoist, with the Motto "IPSA SCIENTIA POTESTAS EST" in letters Or upon two transverse bands Gules, which chapeau, mantle, Badge and Standard are destined to the Petitioner and his heirs in the said Barony of Fulwood. And GRANTS WARRANT to the Lyon Clerk to matriculate the same in the Public Register of All Arms and Bearings in Scotland.
